All of us at some time have to let go of someone or something precious, but as Christians we know that as well as a letting go, there is a living on. As we think about the Ascension of Jesus and 'let go' of the Easter season what are the expectations of living on that we hold in our hearts?

For me it is described in the words of St. Teresa of Avila, the Spanish Carmelite mystic of the 16th Century. Her words are famous: "Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on the world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours."

These words can lead our thoughts and prayers in several directions of course. But acknowledging that we are the Body of Christ, so we act together to show Jesus to the world and individually we live as a daily witness.

None of this is possible without the Holy Spirit whose presence amongst us we celebrate on 19th May at Pentecost. Through the Ascension we see how very close the closeness is between God and the world through Jesus. It's Pentecost when we are reminded us how close God is to us and how our job is to reflect that closeness to others. Jesus says: "Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time."


