A Letter from Revd Helen

What are you putting in the basket?

'When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name.'

Deuteronomy 26.v.1-2

As we celebrate-a particularly abundant harvest and the experience of a 'mast' year when so much has been plentiful in our fields, hedgerows and woodland I want to reflect on reciprocity and do so in relation to our church life.

Our churches rely always on community and goodwill and this is in sharp focus at the moment as we experience a vacancy. The pressure is on everyone to give a little more so that we can continue to worship and work together. So much is happening that is good and enriching in our worship, in our community life, in our churchyard and all of this is the fruit of labour and of giving.

Some readers may not be aware that as a parish church we do not receive financial help from the Church of England; what we do receive is a parish priest, training opportunities, safeguarding, and the support that comes with a large institution.

Each year we are asked to make a contribution to the Diocese of Southwark towards the cost of having a parish priest, in Whyteleafe we pay just over half of the cost of a part time priest. This means that we are subsidised by the Diocese and therefore by other parishes who give over and above their required share.

In addition, we are responsible for all the day to day running costs of our building and worship which costs approx. £500 per week.

My job is supposed to be part time and as you know we are currently advertising for a replacement for Rev Annie and when we make an appointment there will once again be 2 part time priests serving St Luke's and St Peter and St Paul.



In her book 'The Serviceberry' Robin Wall Kimmerer explores the ways in which the natural world operates through systems of reciprocity – let's make our church a place that mirrors that, a place where we acknowledge our blessings and give back in ways that enrich our community both financially and practically.

Take a moment to consider the basket mentioned in Deuteronomy, if you are already giving that basket will already be a part of your life and you will know who you are, if the basket is one you lay aside perhaps this is the moment to pop something in it in gratitude for those who keep our church open and welcoming to all.
