

"God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen" is one of the most famous and most theologically rich Christmas carols in existence. It's hard to believe that the words and catchy tune of this carol have been a part of Christmas celebrations for 500 years!

Here are the lyrics:

God rest ye merry, gentlemen
Let nothing you dismay
Remember, Christ, our Saviour
Was born on Christmas day
To save us all from Satan's power
When we were gone astray
O tidings of comfort and joy
Comfort and joy
O tidings of comfort and joy

In Bethlehem, in Israel
This blessed Babe was born
And laid within a manger
Upon this blessed morn
The which His Mother Mary
Did nothing take in scorn
O tidings of comfort and joy
Comfort and joy
O tidings of comfort and joy

We know little about where this song came from. Of all the carols still being sung today, this is one of the oldest. It dates back to before the 16th century. Some of you may know already that the song is mentioned in the classic by Charles Dickens, 'A Christmas Carol' which was written in 1843.

We're told in the first verse that Christ was born on Christmas Day to save us all from Satan's power. That's a powerful theological thought for all of us to consider during this season.

The Bible says it like this:

"The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil" (1 John 3:8b).

All throughout the Bible, we read about Jesus wrecking the devil's works. Every time he resisted temptation, healed an illness, or cast a demon out of a person, he made a mockery out of the devil. Of course, the ultimate example of this came at the cross, where Jesus' death and resurrection sealed the beginning of the destruction of evil for ever. So this Christmas, don't let the word 'gentlemen' in this carol put you off course when you think about the enormity of what God did for every single one of us when he sent his Son to be born of a woman on Christmas Day. It's time at Christmastide to concentrate on not letting anything dismay us because we know that Jesus has already defeated evil in this world and one day he will come again and the world will live in love – just how God designed it to be.


Come and join in with all our many acts of worship this season and let's sing hymns and carols with hope and gusto as we celebrate the birth of the Christ child.
